Math: Add and subtract numbers within 1-10. Use items such as Cheerios, toy cars, pennies, etc.

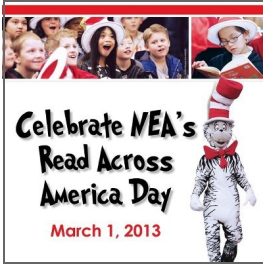
