Writing: Essential Question: Who is an illustrator? We are learning to follow the steps of Writer's Workshop:

- 1) Write your name.
- 2) Think about your story.
- 3) Color a picture.
- 4) Write words.
- 5) Start again!

We've written two birthday class books, a wordless picture book based on The Red Book and Where is the Green Sheep? based on the same book by Mem Fox.

Reading: Essential Question: How can I read a book?

- 1) Read the pictures
- 2) Read the words
- 3) Retell the story

We practiced reading wordless books by making up words that match the picture and practiced retelling Where is the Green Sheep? We chose two books to place in our Read to Self bags and next week we begin the first phase of The Daily 5 (our literacy program).

Math: Essential Question: How do I make new shapes? We moved on to solid shapes (sphere, cube, cylinder, and cones). We are putting shapes together to make something new. I am introducing a new calendar notebook to practice calendar skills each day.

Social Studies: Essential Questions: What is Labor Day? We began our discussion of Labor Day, community helpers and why we celebrate with a holiday.

Science: EQ: How do I use my senses to make observations? Last week I introduced the scientific method by having them guess the snacks in the bags by using hearing, touch and smell. We will experiment with taste this week.



### <u>Things to do at</u> <u>home:</u>

Review the sounds of the alphabet by saying a sound and asking your child to tell you the letter that matches your sound.

Practice handwriting, especially first and last names. Check for the correct usage of upper case/lower case letters in names. Remember to teach that almost all letters start at the top.

Practice your address and phone number!

Practice your student ID number on the keypad.

Look for solid shapes, such as cylinders and cones to send for our shape museum.

# Homework and reading logs



Homework begins on Tuesday of next week. Review it with your child so you can be sure they are completing the assignment correctly.

Please return the folders each Monday so you may have the weekend to finish if necessary (along with your Friday Folders). Many times the homework is merely to let you see what skills we've covered in class.

Let me know if your child is taking longer than 20 minutes to accomplish the homework assignment each night (this does not include the 15 minutes reading time). Encourage and reward real effort but please do not turn homework into a struggle in kindergarten. Let me know if I can offer some ideas if things get tough. Work at your own pace.

Reading logs are coming home on Tuesday. Please read nightly with your child and record your information. If you are reading a longer chapter book, just chart each chapter you read instead of waiting to finish a very long book.

When your returns completed homework and reading logs each week, they will earn stickers for their sticker book page. 20 stickers = trip to the treasure box.

## **Sight Words**

You'll get colorful sight word pages home in your homework folder. You will keep the page of sight words to practice.

When your child is fluent in these words, snip off the coupon on the lower right-hand corner, sign your child's name and return the coupon to me. I'll test them here at school and send home a new sight word sheet. There are a total of 100 sight words available to learn.

When your child learns to easily read these words their reading skill will increase since they won't need to spend time decoding these words. It will help their fluency in reading.

If your child is having trouble with them, just take it one-by-one and focus on one word for a week if necessary. Point it out in books, hang it on the refrigerator, spell it out with cereal pieces, sing little songs!

Then practice reading them quickly so they become automatic. 30 sight words per minute is a good goal. Anything over that will be even better!
