Reading: We are reading books to find the main topic and then filling in the important details. **Math**: We are counting objects and discussing if they are less than, equal to or greater than 10.

Science: Essential Questions: What is gravity? How can you escape it? We experimented with the way gravity affected falling objects.



Things to do at home:

Practice writing stories. Talk about the story and then draw a picture. After that decide on what happened first, what happened next and what happened at the end. Good topics are:

Vacations Birthdays Pets Fun activities you've done Things you do at home Accidents/doctor visits Places you like to go

Help your child sound small words (three letters) but help them use "kidspell" for other bigger words. A great way to help with these is to break words into syllables and listen to the sounds.


